University-wide classes

In the 2023/2024 academic year, the Jagiellonian University has launched a pilot program of university-wide classes, which are designed to provide opportunities to learn about new fields and disciplines.

The program also introduces innovative learning methods using distance learning, which will be developed in the future at our university. The program will eventually include subjects taught on an e-learning platform, in a hybrid formula, as well as full-time classes.

The classes in the pilot program are intended for full-time students. They are one-semester classes, and the student(s) will receive 2 ECTS credits for passing them (30 hours of classes). In order to include a course in the program of study, it is necessary to submit an application to the appropriate dean - information on this matter can be found below.

Form of classes

Classes will be conducted in four different forms:

hybrid - classes are conducted onsite along with streaming on the Teams platform (link available on the Pegasus platform) the choice of how to participate depends on the participants.

online - classes are conducted exclusively through the Teams platform

blended-learning - classes are conducted both synchronously and asynchronously through special modules on the Pegasus platform. Most often, this means fewer meetings in the classroom. For example, of the 15 scheduled "lessons", 12 will be held in the classroom, and 3 will be delivered on the platform in the form of asynchronous materials.

asynchronously - the classes will be fully online and will be organized similarly to the BHK course. The materials are available on the e-learning platform. Individual modules containing learning content is made available at weekly intervals, 1-2 modules each for 6-7 weeks. An exam will be available shortly after completion of the course.

blended-learning/online or hybrid - this is information on how synchronous classes are held. For example: 15 "lessons" are scheduled, but 12 are held every week and can be done exclusively through Teams (online) or hybrid (inclass and on Teams) or in-class. In addition to the scheduled 12 meetings, 3 modules must be completed in asynchronous form on an e-learning platform.

Registration

Courses in the pilot program are not automatically included in the student(s)' program of study. In order for a subject to be included in the student's program of study, the student(s) must receive approval from the dean.

Token registration for university-wide classes will begin on February 20 at 12:00 p.m. Two tokens are available per semester to register for two courses in university-wide classes.

Just after registration, the subject should be plugged into the correct program and cycle of study.

Application for inclusion of a course in the study program

In order to include a course in the program of study, it is necessary to immediately apply to the dean in accordance with § 27 of the study regulations:

§ 27(1) A student may, with the approval of the dean(s), take credit for subjects not included in the program of study, as well as pursue part of the program of study at other universities, including foreign universities.

The application is submitted electronically through the application module in USOSweb or on paper in the case of faculties that do not yet support electronic applications.

If the dean decides to include a course in the program of study, the student(s) will receive 2 ECTS points additional in the program. If the course is not passed, it will have to be repeated in the following year.

In case of refusal to include a course in the program of study, the student may continue to participate in the course, and in case of failure to pass the course, the necessity to repeat it does not arise. Also in this case, the student(s) will gain 2 ECTS points, however, they will not count towards the program of study.

If the application is not submitted, participation in classes is still possible under the same rules as in the case of refusal of inclusion in the program of study.

Submission of the declaration

Submission of the course declaration should be done in accordance with the rules of the Faculty.

Method of crediting

Credit will depend on the form of the course - <u>check the syllabuses of the classes</u>. In most cases, course credit will consist of taking an exam within the walls of the university. However, for asynchronous courses, the exam will be conducted online.
